This one page synopsis is intended to be both a summary and overview of the data collection for the Economic Development Authority of Western Nevada (EDAWN).

The National data compiles the individual State data to then compare each State nationally. In the research completed on behalf of EDAWN, it is evident that Washoe County has made education a commitment. From the Washoe County superintendent's message to increase the college acceptance and attendance rate to the commitment of the state of Nevada to increase graduation rates and test rates, both Washoe County and Nevada report an increase in the commitment to improve education results.

Washoe County is committed to education. This commitment has been and continues to be demonstrated through annual education review, a commitment within all levels of the education infrastructure from superintendent to classroom teacher and through the deliberate measures presented and catalogued within the State's database.
